On 6 May 2023, Venture Scout Ryan Lukman Han and Assistant International Commissioner Michael Poh attended King Charles III Coronation Service and Procession in London, the United Kingdom. Ryan joined a group of other Scouts from all over the Commonwealth as guests. They witnessed the ceremony from St Margaret's Church, Westminster Abbey, in recognition of the service they render towards their respective communities, and at His Majesty's direction to make service to community feature prominently in his coronation. Meanwhile, Mr Poh helped usher large crowds that had thronged the streets of London for the festivities alongside other adult volunteers from the Commonwealth.

Afterwards, they both interacted with President Halimah Yacob, who was also in London for the occasion, at a separate reception for Singaporeans living in the UK.

"It is a great honour to be given the opportunity to represent Singapore and our Scout Association at this historic event. As a history student, I understand the connection we have with the British monarchy through Singapore's earlier days. This opportunity has broadened my horizons and allows me to see the world from a different perspective. I will do my best to serve the community wherever needed", said Ryan.


